This is not a well-known, but all the more beautiful hike is the transition from the Lauterbrunnen valley to the Lüttschental. From the Wengen village center, the tour begins via the Äussere Allmend in the north direction to the Leiterhorn. The path branches off just before the viewing point to the right until you reach the Spätenalp through the mountain forest. After the alpine hut, we head downhill passing the Alpwiesen, before it rises again slightly in the forest. Finally, the trail leads downhill through ditches, forest lightings, meadows and deciduous forests to Burglauenen station. From here, the Berner Oberlandbahn runs to Grindelwald or Zweilütschinen.

Startpoint:

Wengen, Bahnhof, Burglauenen

Destinationpoint:

Bahnhof Burglauenen

Directions:

Wengen - Leiterhorn - Spätenenalp - Burglauenen

Equipent:

Normal hiking gear, hiking boots with good soles.

Getting There:

Via Bern or Lucerne to Interlaken. Or from the south, via the Grimsel Pass (summer only) or the Simplon Pass and the Lötschberg car-transport train to Interlaken. Then follow the signs to Lauterbrunnen. Wengen is car-free. The car stays in Lauterbrunnen - the journey to Wengen continues on the Wengernalp Railway.

Parking:

Lauterbrunnen multi-storey car park directly at the railway station or the uncovered car park by the church.

Public Transit:

Via Bern or Lucerne to Interlaken Ost. Change to the Bernese Oberland Railway to Lauterbrunnen. Change to the Wengernalp Railway to Wengen. Return via Burglauenen station on the Bernese Oberland Railway.
