### Admire the ruins' Romanesque architecture

The Romanesque church of St. Peter was built in the 11th century and is one of the earliest churches in the area. Its parish originally comprised the villages of Ringgenberg, Goldswil, Niederried, Unterseen and Habkern. Today, only the tower and foundations remain. The church is built in a historically significant style, which makes a visit well worthwhile.

Even from a distance, you will be struck by the sight of the ruins' romantic clock tower. It is modelled on churches from northern Italy known as "Campanile", expressions of a Lombard architectural tradition. The church of St. Peter demonstrates the vibrant trade that existed between this region and northern Italy. The church itself was moved to Ringgenberg in the 18th century and this church was left to ruin. A charming circular trail connects the church ruins at Goldswil and the ruins of the castle at Ringgenberg. The route uses a number of different paths, passing a rich variety of landscape and sites of historic significance and offering magnificent views over Lake Brienz and Interlaken.
